### **Presentation Details:**

<u>Active Shooter, Pre-Attack Behavioral Indicators</u>: This presentation focuses on how to prevent a situation escalating to an active shooter response through identification, assessment, and management of potential threats. If each active shooting incident has a before, during, and after; this presentation focuses on the "before stage", recognizing pre-attack warning signs and indicators to help disrupt tragic events and prevent them from occurring.

<u>Threat Assessment Core Concepts</u>; The afternoon presentation will demonstrate effective methods of violence prevention via threat assessment and risk management of persons demonstrating potential intent to commit an active shooting.

#### Presenter:

<u>Dr. Karie Gibson</u> has been a Special Agent for the FBI for eight years and is assigned to the Violent Crime Squad in the Minneapolis Division. Prior to becoming an agent with the FBI, Dr. Gibson was and continues to be a licensed psychologist. She was an officer in the United States Air Force (USAF) where for four years she worked as a psychologist conducting therapy and psychological assessments for military members and their families. After the USAF, Dr. Gibson was a Forensic Evaluator for the State of Washington for one year before leaving to join the FBI. As a Forensic Evaluator, Dr. Gibson completed court ordered evaluations such as competency to stand trial, mental state at time of offense, diminished capacity, insanity and civil commitment evaluations. Dr. Gibson earned a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Psychology from the University of Minnesota, Morris in 1997; a Master of Arts (M.A.) degree in Clinical Psychology with an emphasis in psychological assessment from the Minnesota School of Professional Psychology in 2000; and a Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D) degree in Clinical Psychology with a concentration in forensics from the Minnesota School of Professional Psychology in 2002.

These two presentation are open to Educators, EMS, Security Officers, and Law Enforcement.
